Day 1:

Finding Rest in the Shepherd's Care

Devotional

Day 2:

Devotional

Bible Verse

Reflection Question

How has God provided for you in unexpected ways, and how has this strengthened your faith? **Quote** Sometimes God provides for us when we don't expect it. His provision is not always what we think it's going to be, but it's always perfect. And it's always on time.

Prayer

Father, thank You for Your perfect provision. Help me trust that Your timing and Your ways are better than my plans. Give me eyes to see Your provision even in unexpected places. Amen.

Day 3:

Devotional

Day 4:

Walking the Right Path

Devotional
